A Man Called Ove

Based on the best-selling novel, this is the story of Ove, the quintessential grumpy old man next door. While moving in next door, a boisterous young family accidentally flattens Ove's mailbox, earning his special brand of ire. From this inauspicious beginning an unlikely friendship forms. What emerges is a heart-warming tale and a gentle reminder that life is sweeter when it's shared. The film is funny, surprising, and moving as it reveals Ove's story and touches on an unexpected range of contemporary issues. Director Holm maintains enough comic edge to prevent the film becoming sentimental, keeping it funny but warm. A little gem that will send you home smiling.

The Salesman

Iran/France - Drama - 125 mins - MA15+

Asghar Farhadi, highly esteemed director of *The Past* and *A Separation*, has done it again, winning the 2017 Oscar for Best Foreign Language movie. The movie follows a young couple living in Tehran, who move into a new apartment after their old flat is damaged. An incident linked to the previous tenant of their new home, seemingly a prostitute, dramatically changes the couple's life. A.O. Scott from the *NY Times* says that "Farhadi builds a solid and suspenseful plot out of ordinary incidents, and packs it with rich and resonant ideas". This stunning film also won Best Actor & Best screenplay at Cannes in 2016.

Sense of an Ending

This 'highly wrought meditation on ageing, memory and regret' is an adaptation of a novel by Julian Barnes which won the Man Booker prize. Jim Broadbent plays Tony Webster, a man in his 70s living a quiet life until a letter arrives that forces him to confront early life events. The film depicts the way in which rash youthful decisions can change the course of one's life, as well as the way in which we selectively self-edit memories. As he proceeds to uncover truths long denied, Webster meets the girl he courted years before, played as an older woman by Charlotte Rampling.

Hidden Figures is the inspiring, previously untold story of three mathematicians employed by NASA in the early days of the space race with the USSR, when American prestige was on the line. Working quietly in the background in an era of pervasive prejudice, the gifted trio played a crucial role in overcoming the challenges of putting a man into orbit. Their story is surprising enough in itself; it is related (as Sandra Hall puts it) with 'verve and charm' and the likeability of the characters has helped make this a cheerful and popular film.

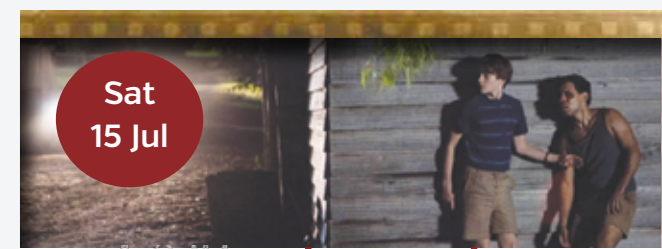
